<p><b>Entries close (online):</b> 12pm Saturday 19th September 2020</p> <p><b>Late entries close:</b> 4:30pm on the day of racing Late entry fee: extra \$5 per rider.</p> <p><b>Registration:</b> At advertised practice times. Closes at 5:00pm on race night</p>	<p>Transponders will be used at this event. All riders must have a functioning transponder in order to be scored. It is the responsibility of the rider / parent / guardian to check race nomination details at the transponder checking station on the day of the event.</p> <p>Note. Sprockets/mini wheelers are not scored and do not need a transponder. These classes must register at the Registration Office.</p> <p>Any nomination amendments need to be made at least 30 minutes before the start of racing at the Registration Office.</p> <p>A text needs to be sent to 0492 974 848 before registration ends if a nominated rider is no longer able to participate in the event.</p>

(Not back to entered class). **Racing:** All rules referenced are from the **current** BMX rule book. Australian Regional Applications (ARA).

Event format.

- Mini Wheelers (participation class): Race from 5:30pm to 6pm, followed by presentation of trophies. 6.15pm
- Event format is 5 motos with Sprockets completing their 5th moto before the break. Sprocket presentation of trophies in break. Followed by finals and extra moto for all other classes, presentation at end of event.
- Transfers and Scoring scrambled motos rule (12.1 (a)). Class sizes & qualifiers rule (12.3). Olympic lane draw in 'deadman' finals (rule 18). Class of 1 full gate or less riders' rule (12.2 (a)). Tied scores rule (12.4).
- Undersubscribed classes will be merged (by close of on-line entries) with an older category; however, classes with a maximum age of more than 24 shall be merged with the next younger category (rule 6).
- Riding up and genders. Challenge class riders may enter classes equal to and above their age and gender (rule 5).
- Equity in prizes. Challenge classes to have equal awards for male and female classes. (rule 78).
- Starting Blocks: Participation class riders may be assisted at the start (rule 19).
- Equipment. All riders are required to use equipment / clothing that complies with the regulations (rules 39-52). The fact that any current Australian BMX Rulebook (ARA) noncompliance was not noticed earlier in an event shall not constitute a defense in case it is noticed later in the same event, or at a future event (rule 38).
- Number plates showing the same numbers as the rider's nomination must also be used during practice and racing. Numbers may be changed during registration if duplicates are identified in a class (rules 53-54).
- Transponders will be used at this event, all riders (except Sprockets and Mini wheelers) must have a transponder. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure that transponder is working and is correctly fitted in line with the right fork leg of the bike (rule 55). In the event of a malfunction or loss of transponder, for any reason, the rider's finishing position will be determined by the officials. Any rider coming off the gate without a transponder or with a non-working transponder will be scored as DNS. If a rider gets a start signal but not a finish signal the commissaires will use best endeavors to find the placing for that rider. If this is not possible the rider will be scored last. Hired transponders must be returned after racing or incur a \$150 fine.
- A protest may be filed by a rider through the Team Manager with the Chief Commissaire for the scoring of a rider. Protests can only be made on the results from the scoring medium showing the order in which the riders crossed the finish line, not the decisions of the commissaires panel that are noted in the results such as DNS (Did Not Start), DNF (Did Not Finish), REL (Relegated) (rules 73-76).
- In all cases the decisions made by the Chief Commissaire are final.
